If you might end up buying the SLSF, you should be telling me what you want to set as the par for the public company. The default par will be 100.

The common approach to the bidding process is to indicate what you want to go for (or what you want to avoid) and the maximum you'll pay. Bids will be \$5 above the initial price or the last bid, unless you advise otherwise. Some players just say 'buy whatever I'm offered', some also give a total limit on expenditure.

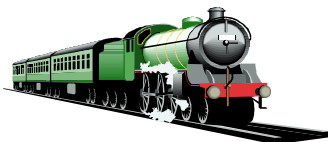
If anyone fancies orders like 'buy any', please let me know if you mean any one (and only one), or any (and all) that are offered to you. It's an easy one to avoid once you know the problems it can cause.

Maps and tile sheets are enclosed for everyone, using the coordinated orientation scheme I'm adopting for new games. All this means is you need to be sure to use the included reference for this game. Note that on the reverse of the tile sheet there is an information panel explaining how to order tile lays for your companies.

After the sale of the Private Companies we'll have the tail end of the first stock round before we hit the first operating round. Enjoy the game.

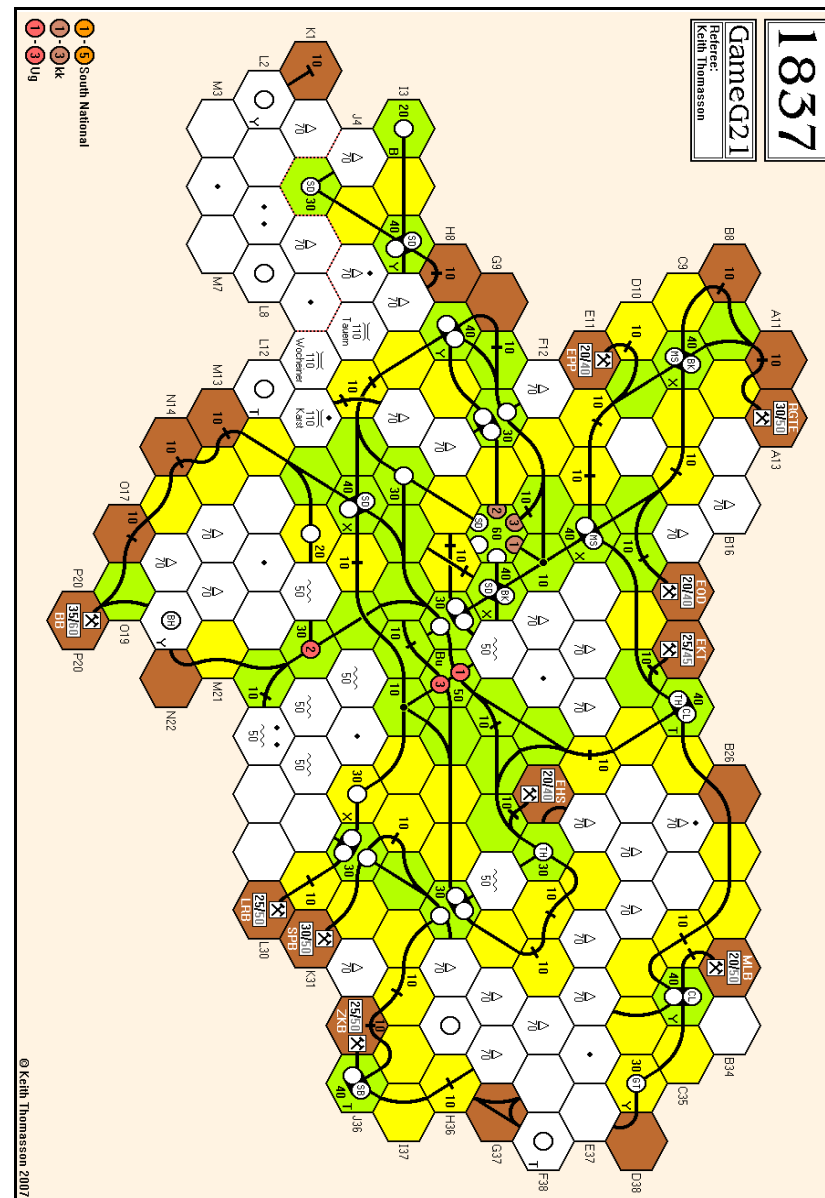
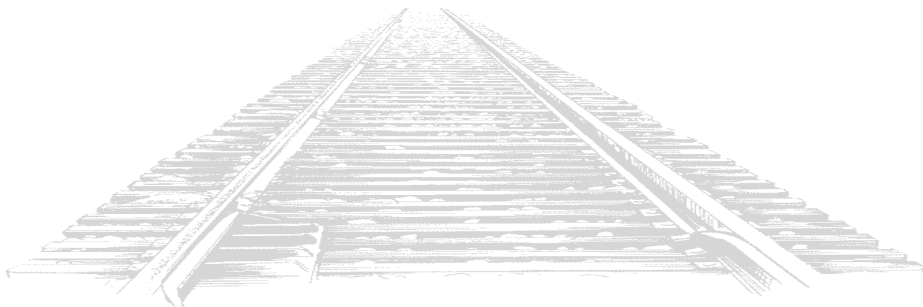

The MLB and BB coal companies can be exchanged for shares in the Cl and Bh respectively before the next round.

I managed not to fall into a number of pitfalls this time. For example, when Stephen floated the Gt at as a high a price as he could, it didn't come in at 104 because the Bh and Bk had started at that price, and I remembered that no more than two companies could take the same starting price. That's the sort of rule that is peculiar to this game and catching me out. I hope it isn't affecting your enjoyment of the game too much.

I'm not going to make you waste your time over orders for two operating rounds, as there's a good chance someone will call for a halt, and with two new companies the trains will start moving again.

If your survey party went somewhere other than you expected, here are some of the possible reasons. The Midland went to O17 because O19 isn't in a straight line from Q15. The GER went to V22 because going to U21 would have been following the SECR survey party. The GCR went to P14 because P16 is a tile, not an empty hex, and there was insufficient credit for the other option of converting it to a station marker.

This seems to be a much better place to break the round. Knowing what your actions are allows you to provide enough orders without getting too speculative on the builds, for example.

Having mentioned I didn't have enough options for Sharon's builds, her first option was the one that got built this time, but she could easily have required all of her options if the previous builds had occupied the places she was primarily interested in. Giving enough building options means giving enough builds in different places. If your options are variations of track in the same place, they could all be blocked by one other build.

A couple of comments were made about being unsure of how many shares to issue. One approach that was taken was to ask for enough shares to give a minimum amount of cash, so you could bear that in mind.

Let's try this sequence again and see if it gets easier with practice - and my thanks to you for being the guinea pigs on this one.

Simon Robertson (TGV, 1st): I was fairly confident that a route north of Dartmoor and on to the far south west would prove to be the best (and other game end comments seem to have borne this out), so I was very pleased when neither Bob nor Steve had the same idea, thus allowing me to go exactly where I wanted and get all the 6 point towns in the south west. It gave me a bit of a scare when Steve actually overtook me towards the end; his dominance of south Devon obviously an important factor in this, plus fairly similar length routes to me. Bob with domination of the north did not have enough links into the south to prosper.

Thanks Bob and Steve for a good game and thanks Keith for running it.

Steve Ham (REAL ALE, 2nd): Congratulations to Simon on a well deserved win. I couldn't believe how far ahead he was at the end of round 7, but he was the one who chose the central route and gained all the Cornwall points and so covered most of the bases. I was third into Cornwall and I thought I would be able to build through Cornwall, but Simon and Bob made it difficult for me to do this. I think the north and south routes were as efficient as they could be and the scoring seemed to be closer than the other races on this map as a result. I don't think there are enough options on the map to warrant playing it again for a while. Thanks to Keith for GMing.

Bob Coull (THUD, 3rd): Well done to Simon, and bad luck to Steve. At the end of round 1 I realised I made a poor choice of move and things didn't improve from there.

I was just wondering whether Bob's real problem came in having a company name like THUD in a three player game. Sounds awfully close to THIRD, doesn't it? Pure coincidence, I'm sure.
