Welcome to issue #147. Later than planned, this issue is the third time that two months have merged into one as far as the zine goes. September just got busy and stayed busy. For one thing, our Chow Chow arrived as planned and immediately took up lots of time. Not that we're begrudging any of it.

After dropping him back into kennels while we were at GenCon UK, we decided to take him on a trip up to Scotland to visit our friends on the Isle of Arran. He turns out to be a good traveller, and that's him on the cover by the 18th green at Lochranza. It wasn't raining. but the umbrella gives us something to measure him against as he grows. He's already up

GenCon UK was interesting, if a little of a let down after the full-blown US version. Actually, I haven't reported on that yet, so let's do them in the proper order.

The US show was a quickie for an American visit - arrive on the Monday, set up on the Tuesday and Wednesday, do the show for four days and fly out the next Monday. We did get some time to look around the city, but on the whole it was the show. Last year I looked after the train games, this year Valerie and I were on the other side of the stand handling The Settlers of Catan. A large part of this was knighting people who had collected the five ribbons from the demo program to get a 50% voucher and a ticket to Sunday's raffle. This started off slowly as very few people got all five ribbons on the first day, but by the Saturday it was a constant stream. With that there was never enough time to get round the show properly. On Saturday we had a queue past us for most of the day, waiting in line for the Bella Sara stand two lanes over. Hayden Panettiere, currently appearing as the cheer leader in Heroes, was there all day meeting people and signing stuff.

We got delayed on our return due to bad weather, but although we left Indianapolis 31/2 hours later than planned, we arrived in London just 2 hours behind schedule as the wait in Chicago ended up being a lot shorter. Unfortunately our bags didn't make the same flight we were on, so we stayed for the next one to pick them up. So much for security regulations and 'rush' labels on the bags...

GenCon UK was also on for four days, but with about 10% of the visitors. The entire trade hall was about three times the size of Mayfair's booth at the US show, and was nowhere near as busy. Being in a separate building, people had to decide to come over to see what there was, rather than dropping in between gaming sessions. Still, we covered our costs and could well be back there next year.

I misread Mark's note about the Einfach Genial tournament - he isn't organising it, that pleasure remains with Alan Farrell.

The next convention is TringCon - or perhaps I should say the most recent, as it will have taken place before most of you see this. We have 30 people signed up and more possibly turning up on the day, which will make it one of the best attended. The proceeds from the event will be donated to the Iain Rennie Hospice at Home.

Another local event takes place on November 10th. GamesFest 2 is in the Victoria Hall in Tring, featuring a Magic the Gathering tournament, Memoir '44, Deadlands RPG, Talisman, Warhammer 40K and roleplay, Savage Worlds and more. It's much more of a role playing day, but I'll find out for sure because I'll be taking Heron Games there.

The International Gamers Award has also been announced, and the winners are:

Multi-Player Category . . . Through the Ages (Czech Board Games) Two-player category . . . Mr. Jack (Hurrican Games)

The IGA awards don't have second and third places as such, but the voting system showed which other titles were in the running. For the multi-player category the main contenders were Pillars of the Earth, Notre Dame and Canal Mania, while for the two-player category they were Medici vs Strozzi and BattleLore.

Both of these awards will be presented at the Essen show. The Deutscher Spiele Preis presentation is during the press conference on the Wednesday, while the IGA presentation will be at the Czech Board Games booth at 5pm on the Friday of the show.

With the exception of Through the Ages, which was a limited print run and was sold out a long time ago, I can supply all of the games on these award lists, so bear me in mind if you're thinking about getting some. As for Through the Ages, that should be available later this year as it is being republished by FRED Distribution.

Some of you may have found this already, but recent copies of the zine are now available on the web site as PDF downloads for the Adobe Reader.

The main reason I hadn't done this before was that the font I use is marked as 'non-embeddable', meaning that Adobe Acrobat would not make allow a PDF to include this font. As it was part of the zine's style I didn't want to ditch it for that reason alone. It turns out that some of the free PDF creators don't check this and are quite happy to do the job. The PDF copies have an extra page at the start so that reports intended to appear on facing pages can be read as such on screen and when printed out.



John Shelley (1st): Well that worked out quite well didn't it, Gromit? I made my first mistake in OR1 when I misordered the tile lay on O15, and yes Keith, I did use your tile sheet, I'd intended to lay a #202 rather than a #201. Maybe that made it unattractive to any potential take over. Subsequently after Don had plunged his cash into the MsE I found myself able to gain the Presidency of the WtE which fitted nicely with the ByE, also having two Minors helped get finance and trains into the two Majors. Route development was done with a view to both the companies running the same routes so there was a lot of mutual benefit promotion and tile laying. Don's action in OR14 of buying a '6+6' caught me on the hop as I was working on the assumption that there was no benefit to anyone in buying one as I considered that there wasn't enough time to recover the lost ground before the game ended. A knock-on effect was that in the subsequent SR I couldn't offload my SxE share and get a 20% WtE by Nationalisation as Mark had filled the Bank Pool up. As ever thanks to Keith for running the game and to the rest of you for playing.

GAME ORDERS

Please observe these guidelines when sending your orders.

- The game name and game number must be given for each set of orders.
- Your own name and where relevant, your company name and game colour, must be given for all game orders, preferably at the top of the orders.
- When you need to refer to other players in a game, you should use their company name *and* colour if these are present in the game.
- **②** Do not use both sides of the same sheet of paper for different games.
- When sending orders via e-mail, make sure they are sent as plain text, with FWTDR or die rolls somewhere in the subject line.
- **©** E-mail orders should be sent to one address only. You may know of more than one address that can reach me, but they all converge on one mailbox. When orders are sent to more than one source, I have to check they are in fact identical.
- Leave a reasonable space between orders for different games so that they can be easily separated and filed. If you're typing your orders, put at least three blank lines between orders for different games. I expect a minimum of two inches of paper for each game. On the other hand, please do not submit orders using double-line spacing throughout, as this tends to push a simple set of orders onto two sheets of paper.
- Remember that the deadlines given are when the orders should reach me, *not* when orders should be sent. Please do not rely on speedy postal delivery, or on instant email delivery.

Handling NMRs (No Move Received)

- **9** If you normally post orders to me and I do not have an e-mail address for you, I cannot remind you but will give as much time as possible for late orders to arrive.
- If I have an e-mail address for you, I will usually send a reminder the day after the deadline, although this is not guaranteed.
- **3** If you are unable to provide orders straight away, it is of immense help if you can reply to any reminder and let me know when you hope to provide orders.
- Games will not normally be held over due to a shortage of orders.
- My actions for a player with no orders depends on the game, but usually involves holding still unless the game has specific rules for NMRs. For Bus Boss and Railway Rivals runs, I will take a brief look at the game and enter the player runs that cost the least, to avoid skewing the results for the other players.
- If orders arrive once I have adjudicated a game, I may rerun it, but this is entirely at my discretion and depends on how much time I have.

GAME STANDARDS

Games that involve auctions

I interpret auction orders in the following way.

A bid for a specific figure means just that -you will bid that figure and nothing else. If you want to bid above a previous bid and are willing to go to a maximum bid, then order your bid *up to* that maximum. You will then bid the minimum possible, and keep bidding until you win the auction or reach your maximum. If you are entitled to any discounts, do not deduct the discount before bidding. Any applicable discounts will be deducted after the auction is over.

Bus Boss and Railway Rivals

For Railway Rivals, the games I run use a single building allowance during the building rounds, rather than three separate die rolls.

During the operating rounds, Bus Boss scoring is used for both games. This shares 30 points between all entrants. If only one player enters a run, they get the full 30 points (less any payments they need to make to rivals). Players who complete a run in the same turn share placings. If shared placings mean that points cannot be shared evenly, the poorer player at the time of the run gains the odd point. If the players are tied before the run, the odd point is discarded.

When ordering for operating rounds, you should always list the runs in their proper sequence. You should not list runs you are not entering, as this often makes orders more confusing. If one or more runs is conditional on joint runs or other arrangements being accepted, the conditional order should appear against the run so that I can check the conditions before proceeding.

The maximum you may pay any single player in a run is ten points. If the length of the route you need to enter a run is more than twice the shortest route of any other entrant, your entry will be rejected, but that run will count towards the number that you are allowed to enter.

Rules for carried over runs:

Bus Boss;

The limit of five runs applies at all times.

Railway Rivals:

If 1 run is carried over, then you are still limited to 4 runs.

If 2 or 3 are carried over, then you can enter 5 runs.

If 4 or 5 are carried over, then you can enter 6 runs.

If 6 or 7 are carried over, then you can enter 7, and so on, but the referee may need sorting out if it gets this bad (i.e. building allowances were too small). In all these cases, you can choose your runs from all those available.
